


## Saturday Sampler-Block 20

## Indiana Puzzle

Block finishes 6" square (6½" unfinished)




## What you need:

 $\label{eq:Fabric 1} \begin{array}{l} \mbox{(white): two $2\%$" squares (A), and eight $11/2$" squares (B)$ \\ \mbox{Fabric 2 (green): two $2\%$" squares (piece C)$ \\ \mbox{Fabric 3 (pink): one $21/2$" square (D) and eight $11/2$" squares (E)$ \\ \end{array}$ 


Sew it together:


Make the half-square triangles (HST). Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" Fabric 1 squares (fig. 1). Layer one RST with a 2<sup>7</sup>/<sub>9</sub>" fabric 2 square and sew a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam on both sides of the drawn line (fig. 2). Cut on the drawn line and press toward fabric 2. Yield: 4 HST (Fig. 3).





Using the 1½" squares of Fabrics 1 and 3, make (4) four-patch units (Fig. 4)

Piece block together following diagrams below. Block should measure 6½" square at this point.









I always like to show how the block looks in a quilt so here is an option for the Indiana Puzzle block.

When set together, this block really needs sashing. You can see the secondary design where the corners come together.
