


## Saturday Sampler-Block 22

## Weathervane

Block finishes 6" square (6½ unfinished)

This block is one of my favorites. It is so easy to stitch and it can take on so many variations with color, fabric placement, and a fussy cut center.




What you need:

Fabric 1 (center): one 2½" square (A) Fabric 2 (pink): four 2½" squares (B) Fabric 3 (green): four 1½" squares (C) and four 1⅔" squares (D) Fabric 4( white): 12 1½" squares (E) and (F), and four 1⅔" squares (G)


Sew it together:

1. Draw a diagonal line on the back of eight 1½" Fabric 4 squares (fig. 1). Place a Fabric 4 square RST on top of a 2½" square of Fabric 2. Sew on the drawn line (fig. 2). Trim corner ¼" from the sewing line (fig. 3). Press toward the corner triangle. Place a Fabric 4 square RST on the corner of the square and sew on the drawn line as shown in fig. 4. Trim corner ¼" from the sewing line (fig. 5) Press toward the corner triangle (fig. 8). Repeat to make four units.



2. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the four 1<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" Fabric 4 squares (fig 7). Pair each with a 1<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" Fabric 3 square and sew ½" seam on both sides of the drawn line. (fig. 8). Cut apart and press seam toward the Fabric 3 triangle (fig. 9). Yield 8 HST units.

3. Collect the HSTs from Step 2 and the C squares and F squares to make the corner four-patch units as shown in fig. 10-12. Make four units.



4. Piece block as shown below.
