

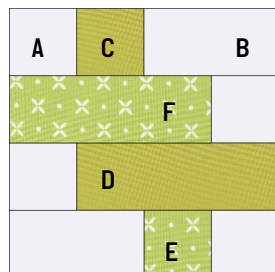


## Saturday Sampler-Block 5

### Simple Irish Knot

Block finishes 6" square (6½ unfinished)

A little green knot block for St. Patrick's Day next week!



What you need:

Fabric 1 (background): four 2" squares (A) and two 2" x 3½" rectangles (B)

Fabric 2 (dark green): one 2" square (C) and one 2" x 5" rectangle (D)

Fabric 3 (light green): one 2" square (E) and one 2" x 5" rectangle (F)

Sew it together:

1. Sew rows as shown in Fig. 1-4.

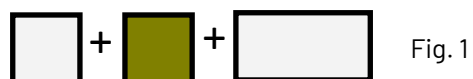

2. Sew rows together to make block. Fig. 5

Block should measure 6½ square (will finish 6" square). Fig. 6



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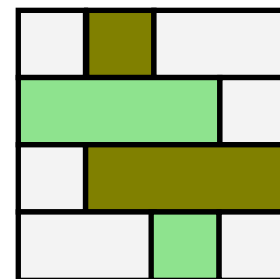

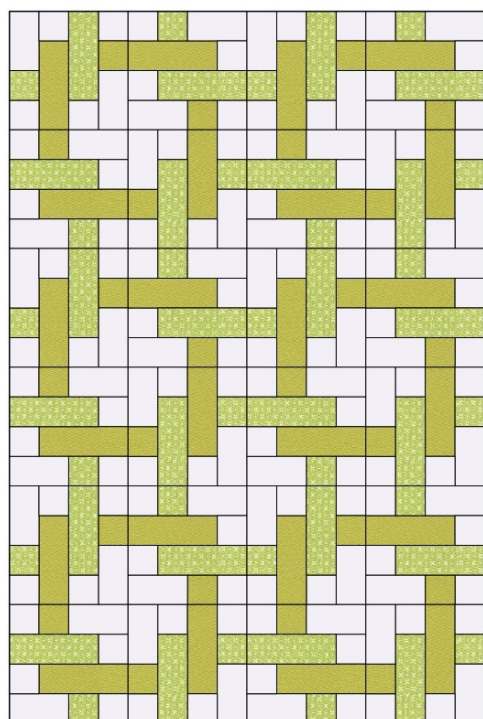
