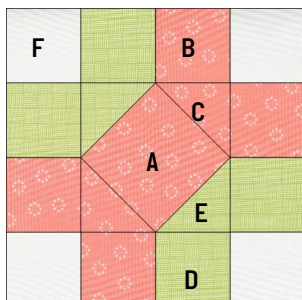




Saturday Sampler-Block 14

Y-Bridge Block

Block finishes 6" square (6½ unfinished)



What you need:

Fabric 1 (center): one 3½" square (A) Note: this can be the same fabric as Fabric 2 or 3 or different

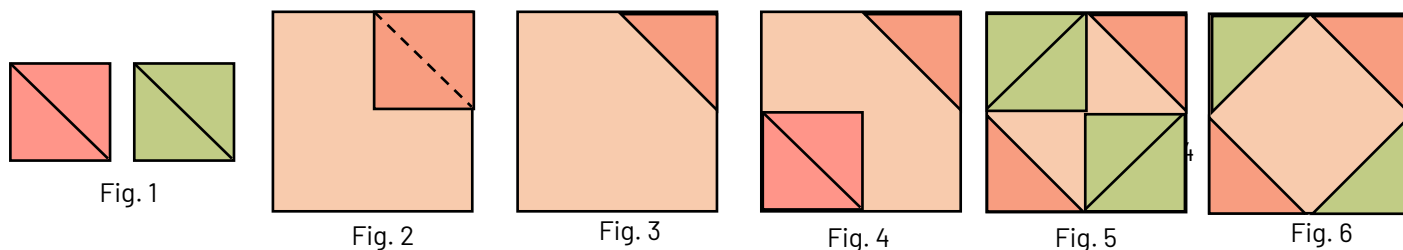
Fabric 2 (pink): six 2" squares (B) and (C)

Fabric 3 (green): six 2" squares (D) and (E)

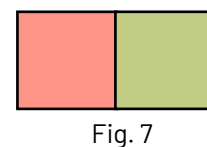
Fabric 4 (white): four 2" squares (F)

Make the square-in-a-square center unit..

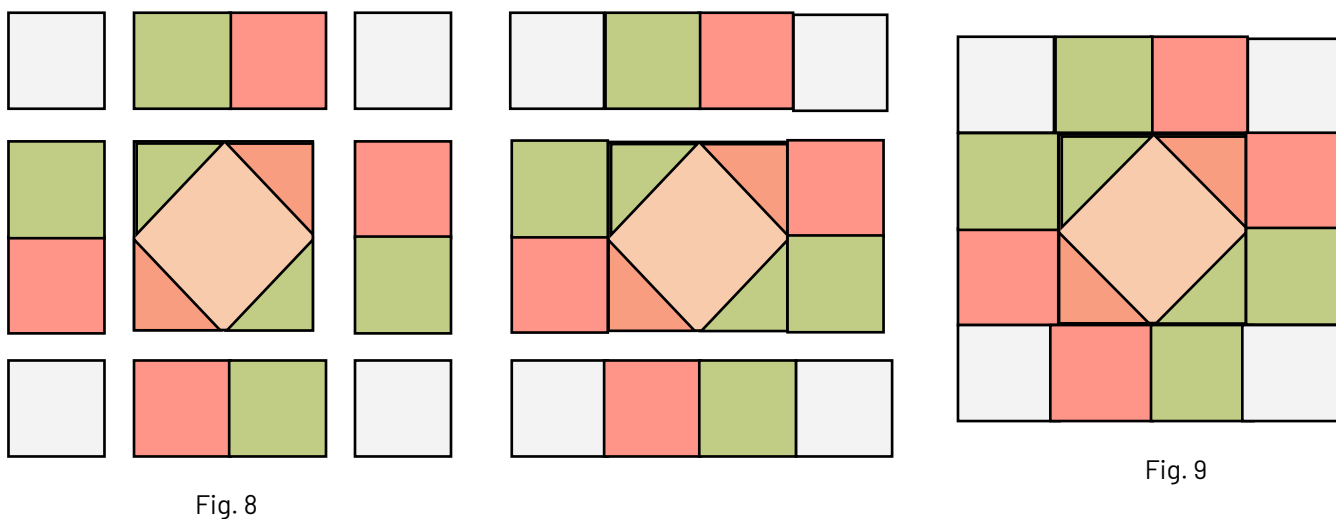
Draw a diagonal line on the back of two Fabric 2 squares and two Fabric 3 squares (Fig. 1). Place a Fabric 2 square RST on top of the Fabric 1 square. Sew on the drawn line (Fig. 2). Trim corner ¼" from the sewing line. Press toward the corner triangle (Fig. 3). Repeat on the other three corners, making sure that Fabrics 2 and 3 are positioned correctly. (Fig. 4 and 5). When complete, the center square should measure 3½" and look like Fig. 6.

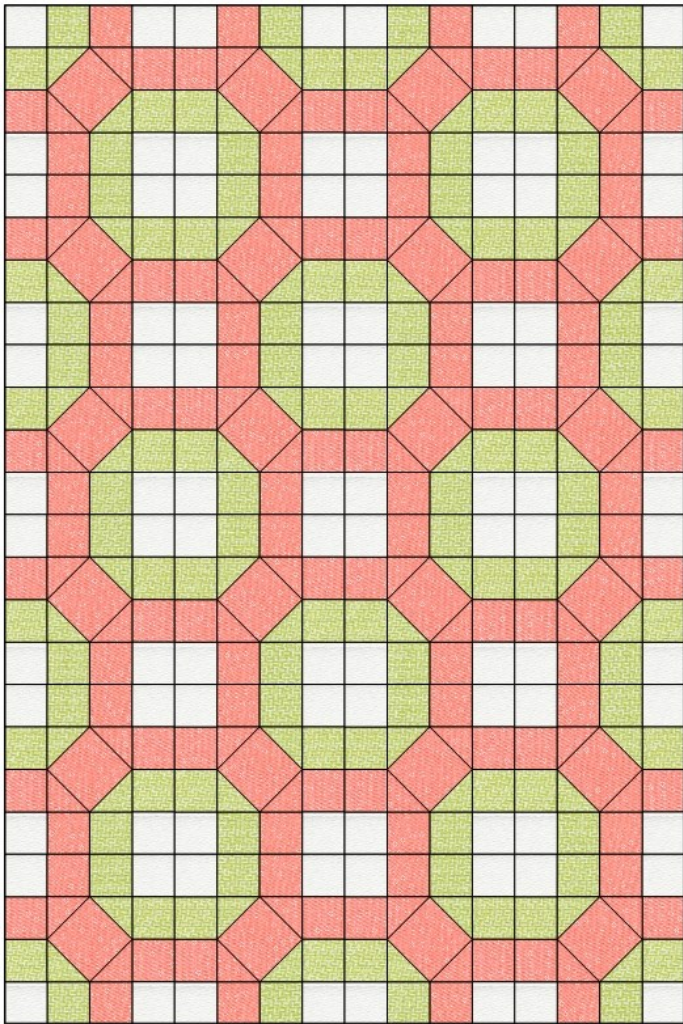


Sew the remaining four Fabric 2 and Fabric 3 squares together in pairs as shown in Fig. 7.



Arrange the units as shown in Fig. 8. Sew into rows, then sew rows together to make block as shown in Fig. 9. The block should measure 6½ square at this point.
